Performer/playwright of The Yellow Traffic Light & Workshop Facilitator:

Isabella Sperotto is a Brazilian actress, performer, writer & creator based in Southend-on-Sea. She graduated in BA World Performance - East 15 Acting School, University of Essex (2020)- in England & in Psychology -UFCSPA (2016)- in Brazil, with a specialisation in Mental Health Projects Management. As an international artist, Isabella has also studied at the Odin Theatre in Denmark. She researches the connection between theatre, interculturality, performance and mental health and her work naturally reflects her interdisciplinary journey. Back in Brazil, Isabella worked as a TV presenter & producer at OCTO channel (RBS TV 2015-2016), presenting the daily TV show & creating content for "Octo on Stage". From 2015-2017, she participated in numerous theatre projects & plays in South Brazil, where one of her projects, "Cafofo", offered theatre workshops in a judiciary mental health institution aiming to promote patients' independent living. In the UK, she performed and devised the shows "Project Liquid" (Rooted Moon Fest 2018), "Hilda" (Clifftown 2019), "Brazilian Gift (Bread & Roses 2019-2020), "Moda" (Clifftown 2019), The "Secret Shed of Trams & Dreams" (Tramshed 2019), "The Wedding" (Clifftown 2020) and "The Fools Journey" (Online 2020), "Spoonful of Sugar" (Omnibus Theatre 2022). In 2020, Isabella was one of the 8 finalists at the DYSPLA Residency, as the writer of "The Yellow Traffic Light", which developed into a play presented in the NSDF 2022, a show now confirmed for the VAULT Festival 2023, Isabella also worked for HARP Southend, where she created & managed the "Voices in Action Project: performing arts for a meaningful life" (supported by the National Lottery Community Fund). She is researching how certain movements and shamanic performances, where repetition and vibration take place, can support new theatre practices for neurodivergent artists and will be sharing some of her exercises with Yellow Minds Workshop attendees.


CATHARINA CONTE

Catharina Conte is a director, actor, teacher and content creator from Brazil and Southend-on-Sea based. Catharina approaches ADHD in her artistic practice and content creation, aiming, through social media (@catharinaconte on Instagram), to popularise information about neurodiversity and strategies to cope with it. Back in Brazil, Catharina graduated with a BA in Cinema (PUCRS) and one in Theatre (UFRGS). Her show, "How to Survive to the End of the World", got her an Açorianos Award for Best Revelation Actress in 2014. Catharina also studied acting at the New York Film Academy in 2010; and in 2011, she studied with Berty Tovias in Barcelona. She has been teaching theatre since 2011 as well. She has also been working with voiceovers of video games since 2015. In 2018, she moved to London where she worked on projects such as: "Sarah's Secret", fictional series for the UNRD app; the music video "Look no further", for Flawes, by Blindeye Films and Red Bull Records, "Blood and Guts in High School", performance directed by Tom Ward, and others. In 2019, she acted in the film "Terror London", by Tom J Kelly and "Aurora", by Nadjana Panto. She was trained at Young Directors Programme Residency by StoneCrabs Theatre. Catharina also works with Legal Aliens Theatre, since "Closed Lands", which had its debut at the VAULT Festival 2020. In 2021, she debuted as a director in London with The Sky Five Minutes Before a Storm, at Southwark Playhouse. After that, she directed The Yellow Traffic Light, which had its debut on NSDF 2022, in Leicester, and is now confirmed for the VAULT Festival 2023. She is researching how to devise creative theatrical and audiovisual practices through a relaxed approach for neurodivergent artists and will be sharing some of her exercises with Yellow Minds Workshop attendees.

She loves creating remarkable experiences for audiences and artists alike. Art empowers communities and individuals and offers a common space to learn, share and be. And she is ready to make that happen.

His workshop is called: "Diaphragmatic Breathing focused on Managing Stress and Anxiety, Increasing Focus and Overall Vitality, with evidence on how breath-work resets and supports executive function".
